Special Session Completed

We completed the special session to redraw the maps based on the new census and proper allocation for elections. I am proud of our work and the new maps can be found on the general assembly website. My district does shift to the west and north. It is my sincere honor to serve you in the Georgia Senate.

The overt political power grabs and illegal punitive gerrymandering that marred the Democrat-led redistricting process in 2001 are not part of the current redistricting process. In 2011, Republicans changed the game with a principled approach and passed maps that even the Obama Justice Department couldn't object to. With that victory as our foundation and data as our guide, our GOP majority again produced constitutionally compliant State House, State Senate, and Congressional maps.
