Georgia's Balanced Budget

We must also revise and work with the House of Representatives to approve the current fiscal year budget (FY 2017 amended) to account for any unexpected expenses or revenue changes. Budgets will then go to Governor Deal's desk for his signature, thus receiving final approval. I am always proud to report Georgia maintains a balanced budget and no deficit!

Committee Process

The committee system is the heart of the legislative process. The committee does what the Senate and the House of Representatives could not do as well by functioning as a whole. The committee can and should do the fact-finding groundwork.

The committee may go outside the Legislature to learn the opinion of interested persons who may be well informed on the subject of the bill. The committee can subpoena for witnesses and for records. It can also use the research facilities of the Legislature to analyze the situation here and in other states. Citizens who wish to be heard are also allowed to speak at committee meetings.
