


Swearing In

Up to 90% of all violent crime is committed by criminal street gangs. This is our greatest threat and must be stopped. I am working on legislation to support our police, prosecutors and criminal justice system to

dismantle these organizations and bring them to justice.

Workforce - SB 3

I was proud to introduce the Reducing Barriers to State Employment Act of 2023. Working closely and supporting the initiative of Lt. Governor Burt Jones the bill is focused on assuring the jobs needed in state government have the proper skills, experience, and education.
